



 - Dog
 - Cat
 - Bird

- Animals covered:
 - Service Animals
- Sheltered with their owners in congregate shelters.







- Work Covered:
 - Facilities
 - Supplies and Commodities
 - Labor
 - OT for Applicant
 - ST and OT for contract labor
 - Equipment
 - Emergency Veterinary Services







- Work Covered Cont'd:
 - Transportation
 - Shelter Safety and Security
 - Cleaning and Restoration
 - Removal and Disposal of Animal Carcasses (Pets)
 - Cataloging/TrackingSystem








WHY IS THIS IMPORTANT?
